Driving Directions:

From I-5, take Exit 11, NE 219th Street (SR 502), and go east on NE 219th Street (SR 502) for approximately six miles. Turn left on NW 10th Avenue (SR 503). Go north for approximately two miles. The park entrance will be on your right.

PICNIC SHELTER RESERVATIONS:

Can I reserve the shelters at Lewisville Regional Park?

Yes. Lewisville Regional Park has 13 reservable picnic shelters.

How do I make a reservation?

To reserve a picnic shelter at Lewisville Regional Park, call or visit the Marshall Community Center (1009 E. McLoughlin Blvd. in Vancouver; Phone: 360-487-7100). Shelters can be reserved for events occurring May 1-September 30. Reservations are taken starting the first working day of February.

How much does it cost to reserve a shelter?

It costs \$25-\$100 per day to reserve a picnic shelter at Lewisville Regional Park, depending on the size of the shelter. The fee helps pay for maintenance and operations. When not already reserved, the shelters are available at no charge on a first-come, first-served basis. Can I reserve a picnic shelter for half a day?

No. Clark County does not offer half-day rentals to avoid potential transition conflicts between events. In addition, due to budget cuts, there is not enough park maintenance staff available to clean and prepare all 24 reservable picnic shelters operated by the county for two events each day.

How large are the shelters?

The 13 picnic shelters at Lewisville Regional Park vary in size and have tables located both inside and outside the shelter. The smaller shelters can accommodate up to 20 people inside with space for more people outside. The largest shelter can accommodate up to 200 people inside. Call the Marshall Community Center at 360-487-7100 to learn more about the picnic shelters at this park.

What types of amenities do the shelters have?

All of the picnic shelters at Lewisville Regional Park have six-to eight-foot long tables, water spigots, electrical outlets and a fire pit. Most shelters also have horseshoe pits and charcoal BBQs nearby (charcoal is not provided). Due to budget cuts, the county no longer stocks the shelters with firewood. You may bring your own firewood with you to the park, or purchase a bundle of wood for \$5 from the fee collection staff when they are working in the booth at the park entrance.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

Can I have my wedding at the park?

Yes. You will need to fill out a Park Use Permit application online at <http://bit.ly/AgGWXg> or by calling 360-487-8337, and you will need to reserve a picnic shelter (see above).



Park Rules

The following activities are not allowed (County Code 9.04):

- Littering/vandalism
- Alcohol possession or consumption
- Discharging firearms
- Motorized vehicles outside the parking lots
- Disorderly conduct
- Camping
- Bonfires
- Horseback riding
- Unleashed animals
- Cruising and squirreling

SPECIAL EVENTS CONTINUED

Can I reserve the big field with the willow trees for a wedding or special event?

This area is not reservable. However, special events, such as weddings, may be allowed on a case-by-case basis with an approved Park Use Permit (Apply online: <http://bit.ly/ApGWX9>).

Can I reserve the sports field?

The sports field is available to park visitors on a first-come, first-served basis when not being used by permitted community sports groups.

Can I bring a "bounce house" or dunk tank to the park?

Air-inflated "bounce houses" are allowed with an approved Park Use Permit (Apply online: <http://bit.ly/ApGWX9>). However, dunk tanks are not allowed.

PARKING FEES:

How much does it cost to park?

Parking at Lewisville Regional Park costs \$3 for cars, \$2 for motorcycles, \$6 for vehicles with trailers and \$8 for buses and RVs. Pedestrians and bicyclists may enter for free. Parking fees are charged all year. Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation also sells \$40 annual parking passes, which provide offer unlimited access to all the county-owned parks that charge parking fees for one calendar year. Will I be charged a parking fee to drop someone or something off in the park?

No. You do not have to pay the parking fee if you are dropping off or picking up and will be in the park for *less than 15 minutes*. If a fee collector is working in the collection booth, you will need to check in with them before entering the park.

If I have to leave the park and return later the same day, do I have to pay the parking fee again?

No. If you keep your parking receipt, you can re-enter any Clark County regional park an unlimited number of times on the same day without paying again.

Can I pay my guests' parking fees?

Yes. Ask about a parking contract when you apply for your Park Use Permit. The county charges a \$25 processing fee, plus \$3 per car.

Can I bring my RV?

Yes. There is a designated RV parking area at Lewisville Regional Park. Your parking fee will depend on the size of your RV.

OTHER QUESTIONS:

Can I swim at Lewisville Regional Park?

Yes. There are multiple locations where visitors can access the East Fork Lewis River in the park, but there are no lifeguards present.

Is there playground equipment?

Yes. There are several small play areas throughout the park, in addition to a large main playground located near the bath house.

Can I bring my boat?

Yes. There is a small, unimproved boat launch at the northeast end of the park where the park access road ends.
