ARCHAEOLOGICAL PREDETERMINATION

The City requires investigation of areas which would be disturbed by proposed projects to determine whether archaeological resources are likely to exist. This preliminary investigation is known as a predetermination. A predetermination will be required of projects which meet at least one of the following criteria:

- When any item of archaeological interest is discovered during the course of a permitted ground-disturbing action or activity (20.710.090 VMC).
- When the Planning Official determines that reliable and credible information indicates the probable existence of an archaeological site in a disturbance area for which an application for a permit or approval for a ground-disturbing action or activity has been submitted to the Planning Official.
- Where any portion of the disturbance area is within Predictive Model Probability Level A as shown in Figure 20.710-1.
- Where the disturbance area is at least five acres in size and wholly within Predictive Model Probability Level B as shown in Figure 20.710-1.
- Regardless of disturbance area size or Predictive Model Probability Level, when the disturbance area is within ¼ mile of a known, recorded archaeological site as measured on a horizontal plane extending in all directions. See 20.710.020(C)(11) VMC for possible exemption.

The predetermination shall be performed by a qualified or professional archaeologist, as defined by the state [RCW 27.53.030(8), RCW 27.53.030(9), WAC 25-48-020(4)]. The State maintains a list of archaeologists who have asked to be included and have provided evidence that they meet the standards for a professional archaeologist. The State does not recommend or guarantee the work of any of the archaeologists on the list.

Upon completion of the predetermination, a Predetermination Report must be completed by the archaeologist using the attached form. The report must be submitted with project application materials. AN APPLICATION WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED COUNTER COMPLETE UNTIL THE PREDETERMINATION REPORT IS SUBMITTED.

When archaeological resources are determined likely to exist, an archaeological resource survey will be required. A survey shall be performed by a qualified or professional archaeologist. The survey report must be completed in accordance with state guidelines and submitted to the City. The report will indicate whether an archaeological site exists. Should a site exist, the City, together with the State Office of Archaeology and Historic Preservation, will assess its potential significance. Generally, a state permit will be required for further evaluation, data recovery, or mitigation of potentially significant sites.

- Ground-disturbing actions or activities where the disturbance area is within 1/4 mile of a known, recorded archaeological site as measured on a horizontal plane extending in all directions may be exempted by the Planning Official when appropriate due to the effects of a geographic barrier
