

Regional Park and Boat Launch Annual Parking Pass FAQ

How much is an annual parking pass?

Annual parking passes cost \$40 a year. They are good through December 31. Replacement passes resulting from loss or damage to original pass may be purchased for \$10. To obtain a replacement pass, you must provide proof of the original purchase, including the previous pass number.

Which parks and boat launches use the annual parking pass?

The Regional Park/Boat Launch Annual Pass may be used at any of the following locations:

- Frenchman's Bar Park
- Vancouver Lake Park
- Salmon Creek Park/Klineline Pond
- Lewisville Park
- Daybreak Boat Launch (East Fork of the Lewis River)
- Haapa Boat Launch (North Fork of the Lewis River)

The Marine Park Boat Launch Annual Pass **may only be used** at the Marine Park Boat Launch.

What are the benefits of purchasing an annual parking pass versus paying the daily rate?

The daily rate to park a car at the regional parks is \$3. The daily rate to park a vehicle at the Marine Park boat launch is \$5.. If you have an annual parking pass, you won't need to carry cash or checks to pay the daily fees. If you visit these parks or boat launches often, purchasing an annual parking pass will save you and your family money.

Where may I purchase an annual parking pass?

The annual parking pass may be purchased from the seasonal fee collectors who work at the four regional park sites listed above. Fee collectors are at the parks from 7 a.m. to dusk on weekends through June 20, and daily through the end of September. Passes may not be purchased at the boat launches.

Regional Park/Boat Launch Annual parking passes may also be purchased at the following locations:

The Marine Park Boat Launch Annual Pass may only be purchased at Marshall Center, and at the Marine Park Boat Launch when fee collection staff is present.

Why are there also self-pay stations at these parks and boat launches?

Parking fees must be collected at all four parks and boat launches every day throughout the year in order to help keep the parks open. However, the fee collection booths are only staffed in May-September, when the parks are the busiest. Park visitors should use the self-pay stations to pay their parking fees whenever the fee collection booths are closed.

How do I use the self-pay stations?

1. Fill out an envelope found in the base of the metal self-pay station.
2. Put correct fee amount (cash or check) in the envelope OR write your annual parking pass number on the envelope.
3. Tear off the receipt end of the envelope.
4. Insert envelope into payment slot.
5. Place the receipt on your vehicle dashboard and display your annual pass if applicable.

If I purchase an annual parking pass, do I still need to fill out an envelope at the self-pay station?

Yes, it is important for Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation to be able to track Annual Pass usage. Please write your pass number on the envelope, tear off the receipt end of the envelope and place it on your dashboard, and put the envelope in the payment slot.

Do I have to pay to enter the park?

You do not have to pay the parking fee if you are walking or bicycling into the park, or if you are simply driving through the park without parking.

Will you enforce the parking fees?

Yes. The parking lots will be patrolled on a random basis, and illegally parked vehicles are subject to warnings, fines and impoundment, depending on the severity and frequency of the violation(s).

What is a commercial parking pass?

At Marine Park boat launch, businesses may purchase a \$200 commercial parking pass. This pass may be purchased at Marine Park when fee collection staff is on-site, or at Marshall Community Center.
