



HPRP

Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program

HPRP Goal

- To help households remain stably housed or become stably housed and not enter into the homeless system for at least two years after the household transitions off the program.

General Eligibility Guidelines

- At or Below 50% of Area Median Income;
- Household must be homeless or at-risk of losing their housing;
- “But for” HPRP resources the household would become or stay homeless.

HPRP

- Provides assistance in one to three month intervals;
- Assistance is only extended if household is following through with their self-identified goals, moving toward housing stability and still meeting eligibility criteria;
- Maximum assistance is up to 18 months including back rent payments.
