Residents may dispose of

- Normal household refuse, such as furniture, small appliances – none with freon or refrigerants.
- Empty, dry paint cans.
- Small quantities of home improvement projects, such as roofing tear-off and concrete.
- Yard debris and tree cuttings with max size of 5" diameter and 5' length.
- Metal for recycling & redemption and AGNA will receive one half of the proceeds!
- Power lawnmowers will be accepted for repair and re-use (please drain gas and oil tanks).

ABSOLUTELY NO:

- Debris from remodeling jobs (i.e., shingles and drywall).
- Hazardous household waste, such as pesticides and cleaning agents.
- Kitchen waste (it can go in your curbside Organics Cart).
- Tires (use the Tire Disposal Coupon with the latest Waste Connections billing).
- Electronics, such as flat-screen TV's and monitors, home and laptop computers, and game consoles. (*Goodwill accepts electronic items at their drive-thru drop off as long as they are labeled working or non-working.*)
