

Treasurer's Report:

Discussion Topics:

- Grace Tiegen spoke about the 18th Street Widening Project and encouraged neighbors to educate themselves and get involved. Some of the concerns are increased traffic, speed, and maintaining greenery in the proposed development plans. Steve Wille agreed to represent CWNA at future meetings.
- Kara Harden Egan has been attending the monthly VNA meetings, which take place the second Wednesday of the month.
- Miranda Sulley reported that since the launch of the January CWNA newsletter, there has been a significant increase in neighbors joining the CWNA Nextdoor group.
- The group discussed adding a hopscotch court to Countryside Park. They are also looking into adding a mural somewhere in the neighborhood and seeking community input.
- Tina Henry and Steve Wille and in the process of updating our neighborhood action plan.
- The next General Board Meeting is April 20th at the Firstenburg Community Center. Speakers will be Jamie Spinelle and Tyler Chavers. There will be a prize drawing that neighbors can enter. We will have paper handouts of the events calendar.
