The neighborhood boundary lies in the area north of NE Mill Plain BLVD, to NE 18th St, and east of NE 97th Ave, to I-205.

We consist of approximately 1400 homes and 3k people!

We are not an HOA, there is no fee to be part of MNA, and if you live or have a business within the neighborhood boundary, you are part of the Marrion Neighborhood Association general members already.

So, what does a Neighborhood association actually do??

*Neighborhood volunteers work with you and the City of Vancouver to provide FREE services, like the Annual Neighborhood Cleanup

(occurring July 15th, 23', 8 am-1:45 pm).

*Work with the City on projects that are important to our neighborhood, like paving projects. As a result of our relationship with our city liaison, we were able to push through the repaving of 9th St.

*We continue to work on pushing through the repaving, and crosswalk painting on 104th St. in front of hotel and Walmart. We recognize this is a huge safety concern, and we will have an update regarding this at the Feb. 22nd meeting.

*Vancouver Mayor, Anne McEnerny-Ogle, often attends our meetings and hears our concerns and shares updates on city projects.

*Neighborhood Police officer, Nicole Vigil, often attends and shares safety tips and provides information on how best to report and respond to crime.

*Neighborhood watch coordination!

*Traffic concerns, such as speeding issues, stop sign needs, etc.

MNA Neighborhood Watch!

Having a neighborhood Watch program in place has been shown to reduce crime according to the Crime Prevention Research Review. *Cops.usdoj.gov

MNA (Marrion Neighborhood Association) started the Neighborhood Watch in May of 22'. Residents wanted to do more to support their neighbors and help protect everyone's property, and provide more safety.

What we are currently working on:

*Creating a solid group of Volunteer "mini-leads" who will serve as a point of contact for safety and crime concerns in their "pocket" in our neighborhood.

If you walk your area regularly, or drive a particular route, or watch out a window, and notice suspicious activity, you can report it to a lead, the neighborhood association board, or our neighborhood officer directly. Email contact available in the information margin.

*Creating a list of neighbors with security cameras, or doorbell cams, so we can obtain footage in the event of an incident.

*We are taking donations to purchase more **Neighborhood Watch Signs!** If you are interested in supporting this effort, or would like a sign for your specific area, signs cost \$44 and are 18"x24" for a metal reflective sign. If 22 houses donated \$2 each, a sign could be purchased and hung in the vicinity of those

Did you know that the city of Vancouver has its own APP??

It is a GREAT resource to report things like, crime, homeless camps, streetlight outage, potholes, and other things like recycling items that won't go in your recycle bin, and much more!

You can find it by going to your app store and searching "my Vancouver". Select the app with the image provided.

From within the app, you can track the progress the city is making on your request! You can report abandoned vehicles on this app as well, but it is also suggested you call the Vancouver non-emergency number too. Some abandoned cars were stolen, and by calling and speaking to dispatcher, they can run the plates and determine the status of the vehicle.

Traffic Calming Program and the Neighborhood Traffic Chairs duties

The NTSA (*Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program*) is a voluntary organization comprised of the leaders of neighborhood associations within the city. Many are broad members for our respective neighborhoods,

But being an active participant in your neighborhood is not essential in order to take part in the NTCP process (Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program). The NTSA holds Zoom meetings on the third Tuesday of most months and they are open To everyone. We do not meet in summer months or in the month of December. We invite guest speakers to inform us of transportation initiatives and projects within the city and throughout Clark County. This information serves as a timely "heads up" to affected neighborhood and provides information about the city's transportation programs that are available for the benefit of residents.

The NTCP is the Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program, it has been made available by the support and finding from the City Council as a means of citizens –and their neighborhoods to *address safety issues on neighborhood streets.*
