Bulky Waste and Yard Debris Disposal Saturday, June 10th, 8am-1pm

In conjunction with the City of Vancouver and Waste Connections, the North Garrison Heights, Northwood and Fircrest neighborhoods are organizing a disposal event where bulky waste, yard debris, reusables, and scrap metal will be collected. This collection is FREE of charge to neighbors of the participating neighborhoods!

LOCATION: Entrance will be at NE 92 ave and NE Pietz St

Bulky Waste

- No tires
- No household trash
- No paint containers, solvents, or other household hazardous waste No CFL or fluorescent tube lights

Yard Debris

- No sod
- No grass clippings
- No concrete or rocks

NO ELECTRONICS, INCLUDING TV's AND NO HAZARDOUS WASTE

- -We will have a separate bin for scrap metal. Keep this in mind when packing your load.
- -An area will be on site to collect reusable items. As in previous years, there will be a free for all collection area for anyone to leave items that might find a new home and shop for something to take home with you! NOTE: All items in this area at the end of the clean up WILL be disposed of.

TIP: Do not fill your vehicle very tightly; It takes too much time to unload. We will have volunteers available to help unload, but please be prepared to unload yourself if needed. There will be lines at times, and please be patient.
