We have invited **Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)** to do a presentation at the meeting.

CERT is a county coalition where Fire District 6 and the Vancouver Fire Department pool their resources to train citizens of all ages and backgrounds to assist in their neighborhood in the event of a disaster.

Several Northcrest neighbors attended this presentation a few years ago, and it was very informative. One example that came to mind was the Columbus Day storm which brought in 90 -plus m.p.h. winds and caused in the neighborhood of \$200 million in damages (1962 dollars). A disaster could knock out electricity, water, phones and roads for several days to weeks. Most of us, I suspect are not ready for a disaster of that scale.



If that should happen - there will not be enough firefighters, medics, police, public works, healthcare workers to address a catastrophic disaster. Advance planning and family preparedness is the ticket.

## **UPDATE:** Devine Road Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Improvement

Construction began in late October 2022 for the pedestrian and bicycle enhancements along North Devine Road. Crews are in the process of replacing the existing path along the west side of Devine Road, from Idaho Street to Burnt Bridge Creek Trail which includes a wider ADA-compliant, multi-use path for walkers and bike riders. Project completion is anticipated for May 2023, weather and construction conditions allowing.

- 3. Help people unload. Help is particularly needed at the yard waste site.


#### There are several things we cannot accept:

TV's, computers, monitors, or laptops. (<u>The Goodwill Store</u> at <u>6425 NE Fourth Plain</u>) Household hazardous waste, propane tanks, liquids, roofing, concrete, and ammunition. We can take <u>empty</u> paint cans.

Yard debris and tire coupons will be enclosed in the Waste Connections garbage bills that come out in early April. Garbage subscribers who receive their bill online will receive a postcard in the mail with their coupons in early April.

**Free curbside pickup of a non-working appliance**. All single-family residents who subscribe to garbage service are eligible for a free curbside pickup of a non-working major appliance one time each year. Waste Connection at 892-5370 to schedule – Please call one to two weeks in advance.

**Free Bulky Item Pickup of 5 Items.** All single-family residents who subscribe to garbage service are eligible for one free curbside pickup of up to 5 items too large to fit in the garbage cart.
