


Balancing Act

Public was invited to give input on budget policy priorities using an online tool. Open: July 18-August 26.



Key Comment Takeaways

- Community safety is top of mind.
- While there are only 20 comments about homelessness, it is frequently mentioned in community safety comments.
- Many paired a second priority with safety (climate change or the economy/jobs)
- Climate change comments reflect a sense of urgency in tone.
- Interconnectedness of priorities mentioned.




A Message from the City Manager: July 2022

Tell us what you think about the City's 2023-24 biennial budget priorities

Development of the City's 2023-2024 biennial budget is starting. The budget serves as a plan for the City on how resources will be allocated to provide services to the community. The budget process is also vital for transparency and provides financial accountability to Vancouver residents

As City Manager, I'm responsible under City Charter and state budget law for preparation and delivery of a recommended budget to City Council for the upcoming biennium no later than October 1. Final adoption of the budget by City Council is required no later than the first Council meeting in December.



This spring, I engaged with City Council on a series of budget

topics, seeking their direction and affirming their policy priorities as I continue to develop my recommended budget to submit to Council this fall. Now it's your turn. I'm asking you to share your thoughts that will help shape our budget priorities.

I want to learn what matters most to the Vancouver community when it comes to livability and services, as well as economic, social, and environmental concerns. The policy priorities City Council confirmed earlier this year for the 2023-24 budget are:

- Reduce Carbon Footprint
- Grow Economic Opportunity
- · Improve Community Safety and Wellbeing
- · Build and Maintain Exceptional Public Spaces and Places
- · Improve Equity and Inclusion
