_____ (initial) It is policy of the City of Vancouver that no individual or business may connect to and take water from a public fire hydrant without an authorized hydrant meter and permit. These permits are not intended for landscaping or irrigation. **Unauthorized connections and/or use will be considered theft and are subject to fines per VMC 14.04.140.**

The need for water from a fire hydrant will be divided into two categories. Permits and associated fees are as follows:

1. Short Term - for usage of less than 15 calendar days. There is a \$150.00 fee for the setting and retrieval of the meter plus water consumption based on the final read.
2. Long Term - for usage of 15 calendar days or longer, but no longer than 6 months. There is a \$150.00 fee for the setting and retrieval of the meter, a \$100.00 monthly fee plus water consumption based on the bi-monthly reads.

_____ (initial) The Temporary Access to Water from Fire Hydrants Policy has been provided to and reviewed by the applicant.

_____ (initial) Temporary fire hydrant permits for limited use during development and/or construction are available from the Utilities Services office at 2323 General Anderson Avenue. When the hydrant meter is set, a dated colored tag will be affixed to the hydrant meter; this is your proof of permit. **The permit tag must be displayed in a visible location at the construction or use site at all times** when using City of Vancouver's water.

_____ (initial) **Straight piping is not permitted.** The City of Vancouver will connect the hydrant meter to the water source at the site. The applicant is responsible for the security of the meter and financially responsible for damage to or loss of the meter, plus estimated water consumption fees. Call 360-487-7999 for more information about fire hydrant permits and associated fees. Connections must comply with City of Vancouver and Washington laws for water quality and protection. See VMC 14.04.210 on our website at cityofvancouver.us/water.

_____ (initial) Prior to occupancy or on-site use you will need to purchase a water meter and pay system, development charges and any other applicable fees. Contact Community and Economic Development at 360-487-7800 or permitcenter@cityofvancouver.us for more information.

_____ (initial) **Hydrant meters must have a Washington state Department of Health approved backflow assembly, provided by the permittee, or inspected and approved air gap.**
