Fire Department Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO) for new construction has two potential stages.

These pertain to bringing in non-construction related combustible materials or non-construction related people.

TCO for non-construction related **combustible materials** such as office furniture - Minimum fire & life safety requirements:

- 1. Fire sprinklers shall be fully operational and have at least partial final approval by the Fire Marshal's Office.
- 2. Fire emergency access to and through the site, to hydrants and fire protection equipment shall be unobstructed. Portable fire extinguishers shall be mounted and visibly and physically accessible.
- 3. Documented authorization shall be obtained from a Lead Deputy Fire Marshal or Assistant Fire Marshal. Formal TCO approval is guided and finally approved by the Vancouver Building Official.

TCO for bringing non-construction related **people** into the building - Minimum fire & life safety requirements*:

- 1. Final fire approval received on fire sprinklers and related permits as well as fire alarms and related permits. These permits have a prefix of "FRI".
- 2. Fire emergency access to and through the site, to hydrants and fire protection equipment shall be unobstructed. Fire lane markings shall be installed and approved.
- "Child" related permits for tenant improvements not included in the TCO may remain open provided they have "Shell" level protection and notification and portable fire extinguishers.
- 4. Documented authorization shall be obtained from a Lead Deputy Fire Marshal or Assistant Fire Marshal. Formal TCO approval is guided and finally approved by the Vancouver Building Official.
 - *Partial TCO for bringing non-construction related people into the building:
 - 1. All fire and life safety features in the area to be occupied shall be completed and approved by the Deputy Fire Marshal to include life safety systems, locks/latches, exit signs and routes, building address, fire extinguishers, and approved physical separation between the TCO area(s) and ongoing construction areas.
