

WHEREAS, June 2024 marks 55 years since the Stonewall Uprising between June 28, 1969, and July 3, 1969, which sparked the development of the gay rights movement throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, the month of June is celebrated throughout our nation as Pride Month, commemorating the Stonewall Uprising, and the progress achieved by lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and Two Spirt (2SLGBTQ+community); and

WHEREAS, Pride Month is the positive stance against discrimination and violence toward individuals who identify as 2SLGBTQ+and to promote self-affirmation, dignity, equal rights, increased visibility, build community, and to celebrate all sexual and gender diversity; and

WHEREAS, the City of Vancouver has a thriving 2SLGBTQ+community, sustaining and sustained by so many inclusive organizations, places of worship, businesses, neighborhoods, schools, events, and more; and

WHEREAS, while there has been remarkable progress towards acceptance, equity and equality, members of the 2SLGBTQ+community across the nation and within the City of Vancouver still face unacceptable levels of discrimination and violence, especially youth, people of color and disabled 2SLGBTQ+community members, so we must remain vigilant and push back against those who seek to roll back our progress; and

WHEREAS, the City of Vancouver is dedicated to preventing discrimination and working to eliminate prejudice wherever it exists; it is imperative that all residents of our community feel valued, safe, included, and supported by their peers, educators, and community leaders; and

WHEREAS, celebrating Pride Month influences awareness and provides support and advocacy for the City's 2SLGBTQ+community, and is an opportunity to take action and engage in dialogue to strengthen alliances, build acceptance and advance equal rights; and

WHEREAS, the month's observation includes Vancouver's Pride Block Party on June 8th, a celebration of diversity and resilience, affirmation of identity, confirmation of community support, and fostering connections that continue to engage the community long after the event concludes; and

WHEREAS, The City celebrates Pride Month by raising the Pride flag to honor the history of the 2SLGBTQ+ liberation movement and to support the rights of all community members to experience equality and freedom from discrimination.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Anne McEnerny-Ogle, Mayor of Vancouver, Washington, do hereby proclaim the month of June as:

" Pride Month"

in the City of Vancouver, and I urge all residents to join us in celebrating the members of our 2SLGBTQ+community and working to make our City vibrant, safe, equitable and inclusive for all and I am calling upon the people of Vancouver to turn back discrimination and prejudice everywhere it exists.
