WHEREAS,	every child deserves to grow up in a nurturing environment, free from abuse, neglect, violence or endangerment of any kind; and
WHEREAS,	more than 2,200 Clark County children were subjects of child abuse reports in 2022; and
WHEREAS,	the Arthur D. Curtis Children's Justice Center responded to 679 children who were the most seriously harmed by physical and sexual abuse and sexual exploitation in 2022; and
WHEREAS,	assisting children and families early makes common sense, as well as fiscal sense. In addition to saving people the trauma of more intensive services later in life, prevention and early intervention services save money; and
WHEREAS,	effective child abuse prevention programs succeed because of partnerships created among the courts, social service agencies, schools, religious organizations, law enforcement and the business community; and
WHEREAS,	all community members should become more aware of child abuse within the community and become involved in its prevention and supporting parents to raise their children in a safe, nurturing environment; and
WHEREAS,	prevention remains the best defense for our children and families.
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Anne McEnerny-Ogle, Mayor of Vancouver, do hereby proclaim April 2023, as:	

"Child Abuse Prevention Month"

in Vancouver, and urge all community members to increase their participation in efforts to prevent child abuse, thereby strengthening the communities in which we live.
