Minutes Arnada Neighborhood Association Meeting June 8, 2023

Approve minutes of April meeting: Approved

Treasurer summary: At the end of May, ANA has \$4,088.71 in checking, \$9.99 in Savings and \$5,056.72 in an 11-month CD for a total of \$9,156.42. Income from last fall's joint neighborhood cleanup was deposited. We paid \$120 for our liability insurance. \$417 was spent on ads. Up \$500 for the year for the ads versus the costs. Jim and Shelly Calbreath have taken over contacting businesses to put in ads. The treasury report was approved.

Neighborhood officer-Lee Gilsinger: Neighbor on Watch program will be doing study on speeding in District 1. Most of the streets need speed humps but not all of them do. Stats: 15 reports last month related for crime. It was 62 last year. 10 of the 15 were thefts. 3 were DUI's. 2 were malicious mischief- graffiti, property damage, etc. Continuing to trend low compared to last year. Shumway neighborhood project he is working on found 20 vehicles that had parking violations. Only had to physically tag 5 and towed 1. If we have a similar issue-just jot down plate and streets, send him an email, and he will look into it.

Port of Vancouver-Julie Rawls: Betonite clay ship is in. Used overseas for makeup, lipsticks, kitty litter, etc. Will be receiving more Subarus and steel, grain and aluminum ingots. During COVID there was a panic because they were out

of cargo boxes. We started doing the aluminum business because we could load it on pallets instead. Port Tours are happening this summer. 10 tours. National night out events will be happening at Leroy Hagan Park in Fircrest. The Port is sponsoring the Fruit Valley movie night and they are a small sponsor of the Waterfront concerts. The Main Street Community forum was tonight. Could weigh in on art, lighting, crosswalks, etc.

Brooke Porter and Chris Sneider-City of Vancouver Public Works: Pavement management program- 1900 lane miles of street in Vancouver. Most expensive asset we have. Good news-City Council passed additional funding for pavement improvements. Pavement condition index used to be about 65-66 and now we are around 74 out of 100. That is considered good. He would like to move that up to 80 on average. Every block in the city has a PCI number. It's how they prioritize what to work on. Two methods to maintain streets. First is preservation treatments and second is to re-pave the street. It is really expensive to re-pave. Every year it's a combination of preservation and paving. They are also upgrading 162 curb ramps. They upgrade because required to because of ADA. Projects around Arnada: Fourth Plain paving project-grant funded using Federal funds. Main street to Fort Vancouver Way this year and then Fort Vancouver to Andresen. Fort Vancouver from Fourth Plain to Mill Plain and also McLoughlin. West bound side of Fourth Plain will be 2 lanes and East bound will be 1 lane with the Two-way cycle track ending at F Street. They try to do a lot of outreach to neighbors that are affected. Tree pruning happens, ADA curbs, pavement repairs, etc. June-September is when the work usually occurs. Will get door hangers about work that is coming. First one is around tree pruning. Then you will get a postcard if your property is impacted by the work. 7 days advance notice door hanger is next with tips on the back. Final door hanger 24-48 hours before the work actually starts. It will require closures and delays. Fourth Plain will

be night work. They will let us know about the noise if you live close. Expect it to be about 2 weeks for each paving project.

New Business: We don't have a volunteer to organize the Fourth of July Arnada neighborhood event so we will not be having one this year. Maybe next year. Maybe Christmas.

Arnada Playground equipment for toddlers update: Fund raising is complete \$2500. With the funds

committed from ANA (\$2500) and the City (\$5000). Amy met with Roman from the Parks Dept. to get

quotes from vendor. Next step is to get donated funds to the City to give to the funders.

Yard Sale: Arnada annual sale. We picked September 16th.
