#### 18TH STREET REDESIGN COALITION - UP-

We've expanded far beyond First Place and gathered representatives from 7 of the 18th street adjacent neighborhoods and Evergreen School District. With volunteers from among them we created a Leadership Team that assures our ability to be active for the years this project will take. Our Leadership Team is a great collection of skills including engineers, businesspeople, educators, folks schooled in communications and computers etc. Meeting regularly, we're getting organized, setting goals, and choosing roles.

Our fundraising efforts were successful and we have contracted Landscape Architect Jane Tesler Kleiner who is creating a quick survey for you and the almost 2000 homes our group now represents. You will see the opportunity to complete that survey soon.

Once we have everyone's choices recorded, Jane will create a Vision Plan for all to see and you will be invited to a large group meeting.

We are going to need additional dollars from all the neighborhoods to be able to connect effectively with 2000 homes, so we will be asking you to vote "yes" to some Neighborhood Association funds in next years' budget. It will cover our fair share of the costs to hire experts like Jane and communicate with every resident.

We'll need walkers who enjoy delivering news door to door to their neighbors! We'd love to add you to our currently short, wonderful list of volunteers.

The road will be widened and we cannot change that, but with our gathering strength in numbers, we hope to have a positive impact on all of our hopes for a road that is safer for drivers and pedestrians alike, less noisy, more attractive, supportive of privacy and property values, and environmentally sound.








#### **MyVancouver Website and App:**

What do committee volunteers and board members do?

**Picnic Committee** - organizes our Annual Picnic in First Place Park

<u>Holiday Luncheon Committee</u> - arranges a holiday celebration for the women in the neighborhood **Scholarship Committee** - gathers funds and chooses worthy recipient(s) from Evergreen High School

<u>First Place Neighborhood Ambassadors</u> - The Ambassadors welcome new neighbors, deliver welcome baskets, and periodically host Newcomer Gatherings

<u>FPNA Chairperson</u> - The Chairperson sets the meeting date and time for the board meetings and the quarterly general meetings. The Chairperson also helps develop the agenda with input from the elected board members and committee chairs. Other duties of the Chairperson include conducting the business meetings, coordinating with committee chairs or other neighborhood groups implementing projects, and resolving issues that may arise

<u>FPNA Vice Chairperson</u> - The Vice Chairperson acts as a support person, covering meetings when the Chairperson is unavailable and coordinates with the Treasurer to audit our funds yearly. Also the Vice Chairperson manages special projects as requested by the Chair

<u>Safety Chairperson</u> - The Safety Chairperson checks and notifies the City when street lights are out and has managed the curb address painting. Further the Safety Chair has been on the lookout for hazard issues in First Place, such as low tree limbs obscuring stop and street signs

<u>FPNA Communication Coordinator</u> - The FPNA Communicate Coordinator maintains the master list of residents and sends out announcements of neighborhood activities

**Ladies' Luncheon Coordinator** - Coordinator sets the time and location for their meetings

**Men's Luncheon Coordinator** - Coordinator sets the time and location for their meetings

<u>FPNA Newsletter Editor</u> – Reviews newsletter submissions, builds and edits the quarterly newsletter and sends it to the FPNA Chairperson for review and approval.
