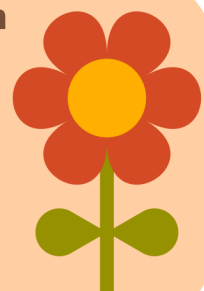

JUNE MEETING NOTES

- Neighbor concerns about traffic calming measures. Suggestions: Document when possible and call Traffic Complaint Line and/or contact the Neighborhood Police Officer
- Police stats: 8 residential burglaries so far this year compared to a total of 3 last year. Motor vehicle theft continues throughout Vancouver with Toyota and Honda vehicles being highly targeted.
- Monica Stonier, 49th District Representative, spoke of:
- House Bill 1110, which aims to increase housing supply and density by allowing more homes on plots of land that have traditionally allowed only one. This could increase the production of "middle housing" in Washington, dwellings like duplexes, townhomes, and backyard cottages that provide more housing units than single-family homes but are smaller than traditional apartment buildings.
- Association of Washington Cities (AWC) is a private, nonprofit, nonpartisan corporation that represents Washington's cities and towns before the state legislature, the state executive branch and with regulatory agencies. www.wacities.org
- Clark County has more Residential and Memory Care facilities than any other county in Washington.

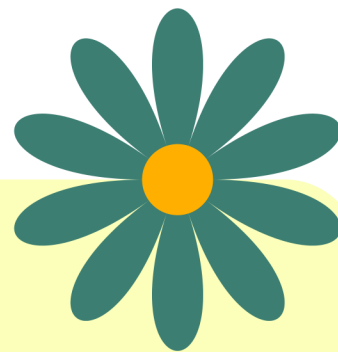
