Inter-state Bridge Update

Check out the link below for visualizations of five different bridge types being considered as part of the proposed replacement bridge. These designs are based on three configurations currently undergoing environmental review. Once the environmental documentation is published, the community will have the chance to provide input during the 60-day public comment period. The trade-offs between the bridge configurations will be better understood, leading to a decision on the bridge configuration in 2024. Considerations for determining the bridge type will follow after the configuration decision. Stay tuned for exciting developments in the Interstate Bridge Replacement Program!

Growing the Vine: C-TRAN Update

C-TRAN, the transportation agency in Clark County and the City of Vancouver, is planning to design the third branch of The Vine, their bus rapid transit (BRT) system. The Vine, launched in 2017 on Vancouver's Fourth Plain corridor, uses articulated buses, improved station design, and other features to improve passenger transportation. In September 2021, C-TRAN started the second branch of The Vine along Mill Plain Boulevard. The next phase aims to connect the Highway 99 and Main Street corridors. C-TRAN has invested in additional service for the existing routes serving the Highway 99 corridor, and The Vine on Highway 99 will build upon those investments. The project is in the development phase, with design options, environmental analysis, and funding assessment underway. Construction is expected to take about two years, with the opening scheduled for 2026.

Preparation:
Categorize and secure your load.
Bring gloves/tools for unloading.
Heavy items? Use smaller containers or wheelbarrows.
No curbside carts.

Accepted Items:
Bulky items (e.g., furniture, small appliances).
Scrap metal (No Freon items).
Yard debris for dumpsters (Not woodchippers).

Not Accepted:

- Household trash, contractor waste, home project debris, hazardous chemicals, TVs, electronics, CFLs, large items (e.g., boats). Check recycling at www.EcycleWashington.org and www.LightRecycle.org.

Woodchipper:

- **Accepted:** Branches, twigs, tree limbs (up to 4" dia.), trunks. - **Not Accepted:** Certain plants (e.g., ivy, bamboo), leaves, needles, rocks, stumps.
