- b- Shorewood Apartments Security System Update "Shorewood Apartments is private property and anyone that is not a resident or is not accompanied by a resident of Shorewood Apartments, Shorewood East Condos or Shorewood West Condos will be considered as trespassing on private property after the hours of 12:00am. Our Security Officers have been notified to stop and ask for identification or proof of residency when they come across any individual or individuals walking the grounds after this time including the pond and island area. now have security cameras located on every corner of our buildings that are monitored and recording all activity on our property. We strive to keep our residents and our community safe nd crime free."
- c- Shorewood East Condos 3.5 M project to replace galvanized pipes completed; Work on Bldg C North Columns nearly competed; New Fence on North Side in front of Bldgs A and B installed; New walkway SE Corner Bldg A; North Drive Patching in November
- d- **Shorewood West Condos** East side pond repair completed; New roof Phase I Bldg in Progress; Waterproofing South side both buildings in progress.

## **RECYCLING DONE RIGHT!!**

The City of Vancouver and Waste Management Recommend the following for recycling:

- PAPER Clean Cardboard, clean pizza boxes, paper, egg cartons, newspapers, junk mail, catalogues, magazines, paper bags, cereal boxes, and clean and rinsed drink cartons like soy milk.
- METAL—Aluminum cans-rinsed, empty aersol cans- remove plastic nozzle, scrap metal, rinsed food cans
- **PLASTIC--** Clean Jugs with a neck,, Clean plastic containers yogurt, cottage cheese, milk, etc, plastic buckets 5-gal or smaller.
- GLASS GOES IN A SEPARATE BIN-

**HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES** - Tape the ends and put household batteries in a sealed plastic bag, Place in a separate container

MOTOR OIL AND ANTIFREEZE- Pour motor oil or antifreeze into a clear 1-gallon jug with a screw-top lid. No other containers are accepted. Label jug with 'motor oil' or 'antifreeze'. Place on ground next to your recycle cart. NO MIXING MOTOR OIL OR ANTIFREEZE WITH EACH OTHERS OR ANY OTHER LIQUID.

**PLASTIC BAGS** – Clean plastic bags- Return to your local grocery store

# **RECYCLING DONE WRONG!!!**

- NO PLASTIC BAGS OR WRAPPERS- Plastic bags wrap around and clog the sorting equipment at the transfer station.
- VEGGIE TRAYS OR LIDS
- PLASTIC BUBBLE PACKAGING AND ALL PLASTICS NOT INCLUDED ABOVE
- FROZEN FOOD PACKAGING THEY ARE TREATED AND NOT TO BE RECYCLED
- STYROFOAM-KLEENEX PAPER AND PAPER TOWELS
