18th Street Fourth Quarter 2023 Update

Driving 18th Street you will notice people in safety vests using survey equipment. These workers are our first indication that the 18th Street widening project has launched! We have also gotten notice that the RFP (Request for Proposal) for a Road Design Consultant is now being created. Your N.E. 18th Street Coalition has been invited to participate in the creation of the R.F.P. giving us an opportunity to shape the qualifications we hope the consultant will have. We will also be included in the selection process for that Road Design Consultant which is expected to take place in early 2024

FIRST PLACE NEIGHBORHOOD GARDEN

The garden, located in the southeast corner of First Place Park, is bedding-down for the winter, but it is still a productive farm. Every year the garden caretakers make a special effort to grow holiday herbs for use by the community. These herbs are available for harvest by you. Walk through the gate and see the community bed in the front right corner. Be sure to bring your clippers.

(Note: please be respectful of the other plots in the garden; they are private and not available for community harvest.) It's very important that we have your input as to what you hope to see in a widened road. We have created a **SURVEY** to provide you with a quick and easy way to be heard. We will be distributing that survey on our newly created website, through the neighborhood email communications, on Facebook and in the First Place newsletter. For those who are not able to access it via computer, we will also have paper copies available. Please watch for the survey and complete it as soon as possible.

We currently have contacts in the eight affected neighborhoods, (Burton Evergreen, Cimarron, Countryside Woods, First Place, North Hearthwood, Richland Estates, Stonebriar, Sunrise Glen representing over 2000 homes) in addition to the Evergreen School District. We have retained the services of a Landscape Architect who has extensive experience in public projects including area schools, the new Waterfront, in our own First Place Park, etc. With her guidance, we are working harmoniously with not only the city but also B.P.A. (Bonneville Power Association) who owns the property that borders the road on the south side and with some 35 residents in both First Place and Stonebriar who hold agricultural leases on that same property. We will be personally contacting each of them because these will be among the homes on which the greatest impact of the road widening may fall.

Our goal is to work with all concerned to create the safest, quietest, and most robustly landscaped road possible. We represent you and want to hear from you with any questions or concerns.

We welcome your participation.

What do committee volunteers and board members do?

Picnic Committee - organizes our Annual Picnic in First Place Park

Holiday Luncheon Committee - arranges a holiday celebration for the women in the neighborhood

Scholarship Committee - gathers funds and chooses worthy recipient(s) from Evergreen High School

First Place Neighborhood Ambassadors - The Ambassadors welcome new neighbors, deliver welcome baskets, and periodically host Newcomer Gatherings

FPNA Chairperson - The Chairperson sets the meeting date and time for the board meetings and the quarterly general meetings. The Chairperson also helps develop the agenda with input from the elected board members and committee chairs. Other duties of the Chairperson include conducting the business meetings, coordinating with committee chairs or other neighborhood groups implementing projects, and resolving issues that may arise

FPNA Vice Chairperson - The Vice Chairperson acts as a support person, covering meetings when the Chairperson is unavailable and coordinates with the Treasurer to audit our funds yearly. Also the Vice Chairperson manages special projects as requested by the Chair

<u>Safety Chairperson</u> - The Safety Chairperson checks and notifies the City when street lights are out and has managed the curb address painting. Further the Safety Chair has been on the lookout for hazard issues in First Place, such as low tree limbs obscuring stop and street signs

FPNA Communication Coordinator - The FPNA Communicate Coordinator maintains the master list of residents and sends out announcements of neighborhood activities

Ladies' Luncheon Coordinator - Coordinator sets the time and location for their meetings

Men's Luncheon Coordinator - Coordinator sets the time and location for their meetings

FPNA Newsletter Editor – Reviews newsletter submissions, builds and edits the quarterly newsletter and sends it to the FPNA Chairperson for review and approval.
