#### **MNA Neighborhood Watch Program**

Marrion Neighborhood Association started a Neighborhood Watch Program in May of 2022 call MNWatch. Residents wanted to do more to support their neighbors and help protect each other's property, and provide more safety.

**And it is helping!** At the May, 2023 General Member meeting, our Police Officer informed us that crime in the Marrion Neighborhood has decreased! Some crimes went down 50%! And some did increase, but overall, our crime decreases 14% when other neighborhoods were experiencing an increase in crime.

What we are doing is helping, even though we only have a fraction of Volunteers that we need. Imagine if we had more neighbors come together to support each other, we could really make a difference and improve the quality of life in the Marrion Neighborhood.

We want to give a Huge Thank You to the neighbors that have signed up as Mini Leads! Your hard work shows and you are making a difference!

A **Mini Lead** is someone that serves as a point of contact for about 25 of their closest neighbors. If you are interested, we will have brochures available at the meeting to help guide you, so you know exactly what is involved.

Neighbors have also signed up as foot patrol, dog walkers, car patrols and when they see something suspicious, they report it to the Police, their mini lead, and the MNA.

We are also creating a list of neighbors with security cameras, or doorbell cams, so we can obtain footage of incidences in the neighborhood, so we can help the police.

\*\*Several neighbors have made donations for **Neighborhood Watch Signs** and we are taking donations to purchase more.

#### \*NTSA Update (Neighborhood Traffic Safety Alliance) -

Our NTSA Chair, Mary Lou Martinek, Zoom Chair, Beija Brindley and Secretary, Kristine Harris worked very hard this year to submit a proposal for a safety improvement project for NE 97<sup>th</sup> Avenue and NE 9<sup>th</sup> Street. We passed the application phase, but unfortunately, out of the 8 finalists, we were not selected.

We can reapply next year, but with Mary Lou being 84 this year and having served on the MNA Board from the beginning over 26 years ago, she is overdue for retirement! So, we need another wonderful neighbor to take the lead as our NTSA Chair person.

In order for us to qualify for a project, at least 7 NTSA meetings a year need to be attended. The meetings are held via Zoom the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm, except for July and August. We also need volunteers who can be substitutes if the Chair cannot attend a meeting.

#### \*General Member Meeting changes -

We are trying to make the meeting months more convenient for you, our general members, so we want your input and need your vote to change the months.

The new proposed months are February, June and October instead of February, May, August and November. Please let us know your thoughts regarding this change.

Be aware! There have been reports of suspicious animal deaths in our neighborhood and many other neighborhoods. These animals have included birds, squirrels, opossums, raccoons and cats. Some appear to have no wounds, so poisoning may be the culprit. With the rise in fentanyl use, these drugs can easily wind up where domestic and wild animals live. There have also been animal mutilations that didn't appear to have been caused by another animal.

If you are aware of a suspicious animal death, please report it to the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) by emailing them at enforcement-web@dfw.wa.gov or calling them at 360-902-2936.
