Our October meeting will feature a panel on Homelessness & Housing in Clark County. Join us as we hear from organizations serving neighbors experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity, the need in our area, stories of those involved, and opportunities to participate in compassionate solutions.

- **Council for the Homeless (CFTH)** Managing the Housing Hotline, CFTH provides community leadership, compelling advocacy, & practical solutions to prevent & end homelessness in Clark County.
- **Outsiders Inn** Staffing several shelters, Outsiders Inn lifts people out of homelessness through advocacy, support, & resources while serving the community with integrity, transparency, & respect.
- Faith Partners for Housing (FP4H) Coordinating shared housing, FP4H mobilizes communities, individuals, & resources of all faith traditions to expand affordable housing.
- Satellite Overflow Shelter (SOS) Providing nightly shelter for 15 people and 5 pets, SOS offers safe, hospitable overflow shelter during the cold winter months.
- After brief introductions of each organization, we will hear:
- 1. What's the status of homelessness in Clark County?
- 2. What are people going through homelessness experiencing?
- 3. What solutions are being worked on in Clark County?
- 4. How can the community help?

There will also be an opportunity to write down additional questions that may be asked as time allows. Please come!

Satellite Overflow Shelter (SOS)

Last winter our community provided 712 people 12,000 warm nights of sleep at several sites. Through the SOS at Immanuel Lutheran Church, our neighborhood provided 53 individuals 831 safe sleeps over 18 weeks. We will again be offering SOS from November 19, 2023 - March 16, 2023, 7 nights a week, from 6pm-8am.

This effort requires strong partnerships from many organizations. Clark County provides funding for staff and supplies. The Council for the Homeless registers and background checks people through the Housing Hotline (360-695-9677). Outsiders Inn staffs the shelter nightly. Beautiful Savior Lutheran (Sun, Mon, Tues), Immanuel Lutheran (Wed, Thurs, Fri), and River City (Sat) are host churches. Community volunteers, like you, provide meals and help the staff. We also have donors such as The Linen Closet of Columbia Presbyterian who recently gave new bedding, The Heights 2nd grade class collects donations, and one individual donates bread weekly.

Opportunities to help include:

- Meal Volunteer prepares & drops off meals to the kitchen at 5:45pm.
- Evening Kitchen Volunteer works 5:30-8:30pm to serve a meal, cleanup the kitchen, & interact with guests.
- Evening Shower Volunteer works 6-9pm to oversee showers, organize supplies, & amp; support the staff.
- **Morning Volunteer** works 6-8:30am to serve breakfast & clean up afterward while the staff assists guests.
- Donations of supplies are greatly appreciated and may be dropped off by ringing the doorbell at the church during office hours M-W 10am-4pm or calling to arrange a drop off time.
 - Food: Regular/Decaf Coffee, Butter, Peanut Butter, Jam, Pancake Mix, Syrup, Oatmeal, Granola & Protein Bars, Crackers, Gogurt, Cheese sticks. (Cheese/Lunch Meat/Fruit Prearranged)
 - Paper Products: Toilet Paper, Paper Towels, Napkins, Kleenex, Paper Lunch Bags.
 - Hygiene Supplies: Liquid Dish, Hand, & Body Soaps, Feminine Hygiene Products, Razors, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste, Shaving Cream, etc.
 - PPE: Disposable Gloves, Bandaids, Antibacterial Ointment, Cough Drops, Clorox wipes, Masks.
 - Miscellaneous: Batteries (AAA, AA), Blue Tape, Sharpies, Kids' Coloring Books & amp; Crayons.

Be a Good Neighbor

Meet your neighbor. Introduce yourself while walking the dog or when you see moving boxes arrive. Learn your neighbors' names and regularly say "hello" or "Good Morning" before there is any need or problem. Just knowing them can prevent conflict.

Keep your neighbors informed.

Contact them before undertaking something that might affect them – such as hosting a big party, building a fence, cutting down a tree or getting a puppy. Informing your neighbors ahead of time allows them to make plans or tell you how your project affects them. Getting their input lets you act in a way that avoids problems.

Be aware of differences.

Differences in age, ethnic backgrounds, years in the neighborhood, etc. can lead to conflicting expectations or misunderstandings unless we make an effort to talk with and understand each other. Focus on what you have in common with your neighbor.

Conflict can be an opportunity for increased understanding and improved communication and relationships when handled properly.
