TDML Alternate Restoration Plan for BBC This Water Cleanup Plan will focus on best management practices and implementation actions to improve water quality.

Stormwater Management Action Plan

This Action Plan will help the City address pollution from urban runoff (stormwater) into our rivers and streams. Stormwater is the leading cause of water pollution in Washington.

Water Resource Protection Program

Do No Habitation Laws on Publicly Owned Critical Areas need to be going into the current update in process for Critical Area?


Current City codes along BBC allows for Habitation in GMA Critical Areas that are Frequently Flooded
