I-5 Bridge replacement - \$600 million federal approved. \$1.5 Billion is hoped for in the next federal grant. \$36 billion per year commodities in value cross the bridge.

April 2024 is eta of final draft environmental impact statement.

Homelessness actions since declared civil emergency outlines costs/benefits of Stay Safe park sites. Bridge Shelter "Big Tent" offers 150 people shelter ;proposed designs on city website

Fire dept. has nearly 100 new firefighters over the last 2 years and future location for Station #3 on Lieser Rd. begins work.

Main Street Promise project from 5th to15th St. includes ADA accessibility curbs and general safety for all pedestrians Vancouver Police have all completed camera program. 9 new officers were recently sworn in. Recruiting is open for interested parties to serve on a panel for police and community safety.

Waterfront Gateway Project behind City Hall begins.

Port of Vancouver: Julie Rawls

Urban Forestry: Jessica George introduces Riley from Americorps. They work in conjunction with Friends of Trees. Sign up by January 30 for tree planting workshop. Looking for volunteers.

The Optimum tree canopy target over the city is 40 percent. Arnada is at 16%. They can help to find the right tree for the right space.

Soon we'll see health & safety trims on trees in neighborhoods. This year the Arnada Park has reached the 7 year cycle funding for park maintenance by the Parks department. Expect to see vegetation management

activities by City ops in the park later this spring or summer.

Urban Main St. Mobility: Laurel Priest, assoc planner and Derek, project mgr./consultant

Overview of Main St. from 4th Plain north to City boundary. Stripe redo through Summer of 2024 studying pedestrian corridor for safety and bike,scooter mobility lanes and changes southbound concerning overflows, congestion and constraints during travel peak times. Derek explained they work curb to curb ;not to disturb residential properties. Concern was expressed for the safety of the pedestrian crossing at Fourth Plain and F Street, especially for school children and in light of the realignment of the lanes coming off of I-5. It was noted that the crosswalk and bike lane striping at this location is not yet finished. They will be finished when the weather allows .

Anne, Mayor said the future of traffic on 39th St for trucks is waiting for additional funding to create freight corridors. These will be better safe routes for citizens and freight transport..
