

Proclamation

WHEREAS, human trafficking involves recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of

a person for some type of labor act and/or commercial sexual exploitation; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking involves the commercial sexual exploitation and/or labor of persons of

any age where force, fraud, or coercion exist and often unequally intersect with race, class,

and income; and

WHEREAS, because there is perceived shame in what has happened, most victims do not reach out for

help, or they cannot reach out for help due to circumstances, so the surrounding community

is unaware of what is happening in their own neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, we continue to activate connections to prevent human trafficking through community

partnerships and advocacy for legal changes as well as increased public awareness for what

human trafficking is; and

WHEREAS, while January 2011 marked the first National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention

Month, we continue to bring awareness to this issue until it is ended; and

WHEREAS, the city of Vancouver remains committed to protect the rights of those who are exploited

while also holding traffickers, exploiters, and buyers accountable for the harm they cause;

and

WHEREAS, this day, and this month, serves as an opportunity to recognize how everyone in the

community is interconnected and plays a role to create a world where we no longer have

persons bought, sold, or exploited;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Anne McEnerny-Ogle, Mayor of Vancouver, Washington, do hereby proclaim on the 22nd in January as:

"Human Trafficking Prevention Month"

in Vancouver, and further resolve that the City of Vancouver stands with the Human Trafficking Task Force of Clark County, WA, to help end modern-day slavery and exploitation in our community.
