Playground at Columbia Lancaster Park 6000 Idaho Street

Looks like construction is underway. Barkdust is being removed. Progress is being made.

The play area is currently closed through February 2024. It is anticipated the play area will reopen in March 2024. The rest of the park will remain open and accessible.

Vancouver Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services will host a playground reopening party in Spring 2024. No date has been set yet.

Tapani, Inc. of Battle Ground was awarded the construction contract. A new STEM-themed playground is being installed with play areas for ages 2-5 and 5-12.

A bench will be installed in the existing play area and a picnic table will be added along the existing path.

Construction activity is allowed Monday thru Saturday, 7 am – 5 pm.

Neighborhood Clean-up & Chipper Event Summer of 2024

Waste Connections will collect bulky items, yard debris and scrap metal. We will be joining Southcliff, Dubois, Evergreen Shores and Evergreen Highlands Neighborhoods.



Glenn Miller, Chair opened the meeting welcoming 30 neighbors in attendance. He gave a brief Treasurer's report. Beginning Balance \$1,642.92, and ending balance \$2,093.80. Incoming funds were from the Neighborhood Cleanup, City Recycling Program, Raffle at the Picnic (Thank you Lou Munez!) and generous donations from several residents. The only expense was for the Picnic \$82.00

Amy Zoltie, Real Estate Program Manager for the City of Vancouver updated us on the Heights Development. Infrastructure design and engineering is being finalized. Road improvements to the Mill Plain and MacArthur intersection will be the firest project to start construction towards the end of 2024. Following this will be the North section of the Grand Loop.

There were questions about the existing businesses – Garside Florist purchased their building in 2020; the City is working with Attorney Gregg, as he winds down his practice and at some point the City will purchase his building/lot. The City does not own River Maiden or the Muchas Gracioas Restaurant, which are both leased, but they have expressed a desire to stay. Angelo's own both buildings/land. She pointed out that this is a 10-20 year build-out.

Building heights were discussed. Specifically, the Fire Station lot will be 4 stories along Mill Plain and part of Devine, and then taper to 2*story on Idaho.

1,800 Units are being planned, so potentially 7,500 – 10,000 residents. Very limited parking. 1 space per unit, and potentially less with C-tran transit. The City is investing \$90 million in infrastructure.

The Meeting adjourned at 8:30 pm.

The Team provides outreach and referrals to appropriate services for individuals experiencing homelessness, conducts assessments of encampments for cleanup and sanitation needs and coordinates clean-up efforts. We appreciate his response to our concerns while acting as NPO for Northcrest, and wish him success in his new assignment.

His replacement, District 2 Officer Jeremy Vanroyce is assigned to the Northcrest Neighborhood, as well as Bagley Downs, Central Park, Columbia Way, Dubois Park, Green Meadows, Edgewood Park, Evergreen Highlands, Evergreen

The NPO's are the liaisons to the citizens within their district and are available to meet with neighbors to discuss crime issues, livability issues, attend community meetings and to answer questions about crime trends and prevention. These officers are the main contact person for a citizen within a district to go to when there are crime issues or other concerns that the police department can assist them with. These officers work cross departmentally as well to assist

citizens with problem solving strategies as well.
