Item 1: Call to Order

The January 25, 2023, meeting of the Police Pension Board was called to order at 3:32 p.m. by Chair Mayor McEnerny-Ogle in Aspen Conference Room at Vancouver City Hall and via Microsoft Teams.

Item 2: Approval of Minutes:

Motion by Abernathy, seconded by Ramras, and approved unanimously to adopt the minutes from December 21, 2023, as written.

Item 3: Communications

Tashiro led the brief introductions for the newly assigned Chair and Mayor Pro Tempore.

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Item 4: Budget Report

Glenn reported that total expenditures through December 2023 were 65% of budget. Total revenues through December 2023 were 104% of budget. The budget report is on track and no adjustments are needed from the Accounting department.

Item 5: Request for Long Term Care - Claimant B

Attached for board review is a request is a Long-Term Care Application Request and Physician's Statement supporting a request for Assisted Living for Claimant B.

According to his daughter, Claimant B has a history of chronic back pain and trouble walking. He recently fell, reinjuring his back and was taken to the hospital by ambulance on December 5, 2023. He was medically transported from Las Vegas to a skilled nursing facility in California on December 13, 2023, to be closer to his daughter.

Claimant B's health and ability to live independently have declined rapidly in the last few months. He needs assistance with many of the activities of daily living as noted in the Application Request and Physician's Statement. Claimant B has already moved into Oakmont Senior Living as of December 28, 2023. Claimant B was unaware that medically necessary long term care services could be covered with prior approval by the Pension Board. Otherwise, he would have requested the service beforehand. Once Claimant B was informed of the process, he provided the required application, physician's statement, level of care assessment from facility, and invoices received from Oakmont Senior Living.

Items for consideration by the Board:

\$6,000 One-Time Community Fee \$5,639.51 December and January Rent

\$5,700 Ongoing Monthly Room, Board and Care

The Pension Board Rule for long term care limits payment to the average daily rate of a semi-private room for Nursing Home Care services. The current average daily cost for a semi-private room in Washington State is \$359/day or about \$10,770/month.

Action Requested

Consider Claimant B's request for medically necessary long-term care up to the current daily cost for a semi-private room as presented.

Motion by Dong to approve the cost of long-term care up to the maximum current daily cost of a semi-private room as presented and reimbursement for previous rent and community fees. Seconded by Ramras and approved unanimously.

Item 6: Request for Long Term Care - Claimant B

At the December 21, 2023, Police Pension Board Meeting, Claimant A requested the Board to consider covering the hearing aid costs outside of his Regence medical coverage. At that time, Board Members did not see sufficient information showing inadequacy of hearing aids recommended by TruHearing. The request was tabled to allow time for Claimant A to submit more documentation.

Following the meeting, Claimant A provided documentation from Battle Ground Hearing and Advanced Hearing Aids which explain differences in service and quality of products from TruHearing.

Attached for board review is a request for hearing aids for Claimant A. Section V.S of the Board's Rules and Regulations requires:

"Hearing Aids prescribed by physician and pre-approved by board. Charges are limited to those necessary to achieve functional correction. When seeking pre-approval, members must submit to the

third-party administrator quotes from at least two providers. The member must also have a current hearing test, exam, and referral from a physician. Hearing aids must have a three-year warranty."

Claimant A is seeking preapproval to use an out-of-network provider for Hearing Aids. Claimant A's current hearing aids have malfunctioned and are outside of the three-year warranty which expired on September 15, 2023. Claimant A returned his current hearing aids to Advanced Hearing Aid for an evaluation, and they provided him with an older model unit while the Board makes its decision. Claimant A provided a hearing test and two recommendations from Battle Ground Hearing, which is a TruHearing provider. However, due to his hearing requirements he would like to choose Advanced Hearing Aid's recommendation. Claimant A has provided two hearing tests, two Hearing Instrument Specialist evaluations, and three quotes for hearing aids that are adequate for his hearing loss. All three hearing aids have a three-year warranty.

Action Requested

Consider the request from Claimant A for hearing aids.

Motion by McEnerny-Ogle to approve the cost of hearing aids for Oticon Real 1 of \$6,400. Seconded by Ramras and approved unanimously.

Item 7: Expenses

Expenses for December 2023 totaled \$43,529.84.

Motion by Glenn, seconded by Abernathy, and approved unanimously to accept the expenses as presented.

RE: Request for Hearing Aid – Claimant A

Attached for Board review is a request for hearing aid reimbursement for Claimant A and Section V.S of the Board's Rules and Regulations requires:

"Hearing Aids prescribed by physician and pre-approved by board. Charges are limited to those necessary to achieve functional correction. When seeking pre-approval, members must submit to the third-party administrator quotes from at least two providers. The member must also have a current hearing test, exam, and referral from a physician. Hearing aids must have a three-year warranty."

Following an injury in July 2023, Claimant A has complete hearing loss in his right ear and has struggled with his balance. After months of therapy his hearing surgeon declared his right ear deaf and recommended that Claimant A see Audiology for a BiCros hearing aid for help in communication. Claimant A's current hearing aids were purchased In January 2023 and are still under the three-year warranty. However, since the hearing aids have not malfunctioned his insurance does not cover the cost of the BiCros hearing aid. The BiCros hearing aid, works as a sound transmitter. The device is worn on his deaf ear and the microphone picks up sounds that are occurring on that side of his head. The device then sends the signal wirelessly to the hearing aid of his left ear. The BiCros is the same brand as his current left hearing aid which allows them to be programmed together. Claimant A has provided a hearing test, surgeon evaluation, and receipt of purchase. The BiCros has a three-year warranty.

Enclosed is Kaiser Permanente paperwork from; Anna Grosz MD Hearing Surgeon Joshua Pluim. Audiologist

I lost my hearing and balance in my right ear from an injury in July 2023. I immediately went to Kaiser Permanente for the injury. My hearing surgeon Anna Grosz MD finally declared my right ear dead for my hearing and balance on January 29, 2024. Dr. Grosz encouraged me to see audiology for a BiCros hearing aid for help in communication.

I have enclosed the Kaiser hearing test and a report on how the BiCros works so I can communicate with people on my right side and hear sounds for my safety. I did purchase the BiCros and it is the same brand hearing aid (Phonak)that is on my left ear, so it can be programmed with the BiCros aid. The BiCros has the same warranty as my left hearing aid. I paid \$1000 for the BiCros and am respectfully submitting for reimbursement. BiCros is working well for me.

Hello there Claimant A

In regards to your questions regarding a BiCROS, the device works as a sound transmitter. The device is worn on your worse/deaf ear, and the microphones pick up sounds that are occurring on that side of your head. Then it sends the signal wirelessly to the hearing aid you have on your better ear, which generates the sound so you can hear it.

As we discussed in our appointment today, it will not be very helpful in determining where sounds are coming from, as all the sound will be coming to your better ear. However, it will provide needed awareness to you for sounds that occur on your right side (your worse ear). One example of this might be if someone is sitting to your right (worse ear), with the BiCROS you will be able to hear them speaking and follow the conversation without having to turn your head all the way over.

I hope this explanation answers your questions, and explains how this device will be helpful to you. Please let me know if you have any further questions.


