This is the third year that Airport Green Neighborhood has been partnered with other neighborhood associations. This year we share this with Emerald Green and Fircrest Neighborhood Associations.

The acceptable items include:

- Scrap metal
- Household items such as furniture and lamps
- Small appliances such as vacuums and microwaves
- Yard debris: clippings, small logs, tree branches
- Empty, dry paint cans

DO NOT bring any of these things:

- Lawn mowers, weed eaters, etc. (we no longer have a source to take them)
- Hazardous household waste (pesticides, cleaning agents)
- Tires (use the tire disposal coupon from the latest Waste Connections billing)
- Electronics: TVs, monitors, computers, game consoles (Goodwill accepts electronic items)
- Debris from remodeling jobs (shingles, drywall, sinks)

Prepare by separating material for easy unloading

- Use a tarp liner under the yard debris for faster and cleaner unloading
- Put yard debris on the bottom
- Biggest items on top
- Then tuck any other items in and around the biggest items



Don't forget to cover your load to prevent littering if bringing a truck or trailer

President's Message

Greetings to all my neighbors. If you were on my email list I provided some information to the many topics the Executive Board was provided from the Annual Meeting this past November. Those topics involved the Hearthwood Park new fountain grant process, neighborhood maps with names, phone tree in case of emergencies, more on the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and Map Your Neighborhood (MYN) process, as well as where we stand with possible park improvements.

For questions concerning the aircraft easement over NE 138th Avenue properties, please refer to your property title and easement covenant documents. John Sargent or Ron Van Bladeran may be able to answer additional inquiries.

I have contacted the City of Vancouver regarding the speed



of vehicles through our neighborhood. AGNA reduced the speed limit from 30 to 25 mph, and installed radar speed calming signs. The City was further advised with several possible options to help mitigate speed issues to protect pedestrians.

- Change the traffic light at SE 1st Street and Hearthwood Boulevard to a flashing red light
- Install a mini circle under or in place of the traffic light at SE 1st Street and Hearthwood Boulevard
- Use bulbouts or curb extensions to narrow Hearthwood Boulevard
- Place crosswalks on Hearthwood, just south of NE 9th Street and NE 6th Street, and near the south entrance to the park.

Speed bumps or cushions are also possible solutions that would be a last resort as these slow down emergency vehicles coming into the neighborhood by 10 to 15 seconds per speed bump. The speed cushions don't seem to give the emergency vehicles as much of a

problem as they provide fire truck and ambulance wheels to go around the cushions. We will continue to seek solutions for this dilemma that will keep everyone safe.



Responses from the City of Vancouver

The signal modifications you're asking for are not options at this time. It's a new signal that was studied and found warranted.



A roundabout / circle, or changing it into flash were not good enough at the time of the study. The best thing to do here is to call 360-487-7402 and let the VPD traffic hotline know you need enforcement.

The city can't stripe in new crosswalks without doing a review of the ADA ramps, lane configuration, and street lighting analysis.

Hearthwood and 144th doesn't have ramps at all four corners and some of the existing do not point in the right direction. It also doesn't have enough lighting.

Hearthwood and 6th Street doesn't have any lighting on the west side.

Hearthwood and 9th Street doesn't have any ADA ramps or sidewalks or enough lighting.

There are existing crosswalks at 7^{th} Circle and 8^{th} Street to use.

The improvements needed to install crosswalks at the requested locations would be a larger and costly capital project. At this time, we are not funded to take on these projects when there are existing facilities that can be used.


