Neighborhood Traffic Update

Did you notice the traffic speed counters that were placed by the City on 157th Avenue between 34th street and 36th Streets? That was good progress from our traffic committee, who reports that we are now in a holding pattern while the City decides if speed and volume counts meet their minimum thresholds for a traffic improvement project. Any proposed location must be approved by Police, Fire and Public Works Departments.

In May, we'll be notified following the speed and volume counts if our location is eligible for the next step, and if so, our project will further evaluated and ranked. The top five scoring projects will be forwarded to the Neighborhood Traffic Safety Alliance (NTSA) for their evaluation.

Neighborhood Cleanup, cont'd.

What's Accepted at the Neighborhood Cleanup?

- They <u>WILL accept Yard Debris</u> including branches, leaves, vines, bramble
- Bulky Items: Items too big for your garbage cart such as rugs, kiddie pool, furniture, small appliances
- Scrap Metal: Metal grills, lawn chairs, mowers, etc.
 MUST be drained of gas, oil, etc.
- NO refrigerators, freezers or AC units. (No freon)

What's NOT Accepted?

- NO Concrete, rocks, sod or dirt
- NO Refrigerators, freezers or AC units. (No freon)
- NO Household trash or contractor waste
- NO Home remodel debris, tiles, drywall, etc.
- NO Roofing shingles or roofing materials
- NO Hazardous chemicals, cleaners, paint, stains or fluids such as gasoline, oil or antifreeze
- NO TVs, computers or electronics.
- NO CFL or fluorescent tube lights
- NO very LARGE items such as boats and hot tubs
