September 26 Meeting Notes Columbia Play Project

Since forming at the beginning of 2020, Columbia Play Project has taken hands-on, active, exploratory play to children and families all over Clark County, serving more than 50,000 people through its Mobile Children’s Museum and special events.

But their eye is still on the original goal, to build a children’s museum in Clark County.

The Association of Children’s Museums defines such a place as “a nonprofit educational and cultural institution committed to serving the needs and interests of children by providing exhibits and programs that stimulate curiosity, motivate learning, and support the wellbeing of families.”

Through Nov. 10, the nonprofit is taking ideas from the public about what they envision in a children’s museum. The survey can be found at columbiaplayproject.org/dream. Once this input is compiled, the board will use it as direction to plan the brick-and-mortar museum, including the location. This is part of a state planning grant obtained by Sen. Annette Cleveland.

Since the Portland Children’s Museum closed in 2021, the closest such museums are in Olympia and Salem.
