Minutes of March 13<sup>th</sup> meeting and treasurers report were approved. Treasury is essentially stable since beginning of 2025, only income/expense is related to ad sheets, a loss of \$45. Amy is using Square for sponsor payments. Korey Flynn Senior Public Services Agent with Ft Vancouver Regional Library (FVRL)

2025 is the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the FVRL. Celebrating with a "passport" to the encourage visits to all 15 libraries.

Anyone can get a free card which gives access to the other 14 libraries in SW Washington. Also gives access to Multnomah County Library free. Cowlitz County residents can get a FVRL card for a fee.

FVRL offers use of PCs and printing; \$3 week free printing otherwise 10/50 cents for BW/color copies.

There is learning center with interactive play for kids.

A gathering hang-out area for 13-19 year old with an open mike night. Story time for toddlers and preschoolers. Sensory story options for special needs kids.

Development opportunities for artists, writers, sewing, speakers, hobby instructions, crochet, car repair.

Online access to tutoring, ACT preparation, ESL, citizenship preparation. Consumer Reports in magazine and online with your library card. Libby app has ebooks & audiobooks; HOOPLA has ebooks, audiobooks, music, TV shows, & movies and Kanopy for movie streaming.

FVRL curates a seed library, get seeds and drop off seed you harvest in your yard.

The Experience Passes give free, limited access to places like area museums, Pittock Mansion etc.

Board games are available for check out. Stocked in Vancouver and other system libraries.

FVRL has a Discover Washington travel kit.

Mayor Anne discussed current status, please see included sheets. She said the planned police training facility will take 6 years to complete planning and construction. All can participate in a contest to design a new City flag, see the CoV website. Jill asked about bike parades that happened in the past. Anne said C-tran is planning a bike event on a new bus route.

Arnada History walk: Sandi is waiting the CCHM to reply for a date in July or August.

We will have the Vancouver Community Jazz group in the park again this year and Russ is confirming a date with them.
