#### **Guest Speaker:**

The April neighborhood association meeting welcomed guest speaker Lindsay Smith from Habitat for Humanity. Lindsay shared Habitat's mission to build homes, communities, and hope. Key points included:

- **Affordable Homeownership:** Habitat ensures families pay no more than 35% of their income on mortgages, creating paths to stability and independence.
- **Home Repair Program:** Assisting low-income homeowners with critical home repairs to keep them safe and housed.
- **Neighborhood Revitalization:** Working alongside small businesses and communities, especially along the Fourth Plain Corridor.
- Recent Projects:
  - Completion of the Johnson Village nine-home community.
  - Launching a 32-home cottage cluster near North Image Elementary.
  - First home build in Washougal now underway.
  - A new townhome project is planned off NE 112th Avenue.
- Community Land Trust Model: Ensures Habitat homes remain permanently affordable for future generations.
- Habitat Store: Located nearby, the store supports Habitat's mission through sales of donated items.
   Volunteers and donations are always welcome!

- The neighborhood remains one of the city's most active, thanks to the participation and support of residents like you.

#### ACCEPTED

Any medications in any dosage form in an original container or sealed bag.



#### NOT ACCEPTED

Herbal remedies, vitamins, supplements, cosmetics, personal care products, medical devices, batteries, mercury-containing thermometers, sharps, illicit drugs, and pet pesticide products.



#### MEDICINE KIOSKS

Located at pharmacies and law enforcement offices for residents to drop-off expired or unwanted medicine for safe and free disposal.

Storing medicine in a locked location and proper disposal are the most effective deterrents to accidental poisonings, overdose, medicine theft, and misuse that can lead to prescription drug addiction. Stay informed and talk with loved ones about the risks for ingesting or taking medicine not prescribed for them and benefits of safeguarding your medications. Follow these healthful tips to keep your medicines safe and loved ones free from harm.



## SAFE MEDICINE STORAGE TIPS



- At home and on-the-go, store medicine safely in a locked location away from people and pets. Learn more at LocksSaveLives.org.
- Resist the urge to keep medicine handy by returning it to a locked location after each use.
- Use child-resistant caps and close the caps tightly after each use.
- Don't share prescription medication with others as it's illegal and may cause them harm.
- Keep inventory of medicines to know how many pills are left and if any are missing.

## PROPER MEDICINE DISPOSAL TIPS



- Dispose of all unused and expired medicine immediately and properly.
- Do not place medicine in the trash or recycling, and never flush it down the toilet or drain as it pollutes the environment and waterways or could be misused by someone for whom it wasn't prescribed.
- Properly dispose of expired and unwanted medicine by dropping it off at a drug take-back event, a year-round disposal site, or dispose of it by mail. Learn more at <u>MED-Project.org</u> or bit.ly/DEATake-Back.
