General Meeting Results – NEW LEADERSHIP!!

Thank you to those residents who attended our May 1st meeting and elected three new board members. Their contact information is below. Thank you to Casey Dill for remaining in his position until a new Vice Chairman can be elected. We had a surprise speaker at our meeting - our Community Police Officer, Jordan Rasmussenwho said crimes are down in our neighborhood from last year. The highest month for crime tends to be late summer. Most reported crimes in our neighborhood this year have been car break-ins, abandoned vehicles, one home invasion and domestic violence.

Our first scheduled speaker was Britton Brown, a board member of HomeShare, a new, non-government program for Clark County which coordinates resident home owners and people in need of low cost housing. She pointed out that several residents are already informally in this type of arrangement. Contact (360) 702-2796 if interested.

Next we heard from Koko Olzewski, Vancouver Neighborhood Coordinator, who emphasized the neighborhood assoc. as a voice that carries weight with the City and whose coordinator can help with issues and needs. This was exemplified during the major discussion of the evening - Ginn Corp has been surveying the radio tower property and the radio station is selling. <u>See page 2</u>. Ginn is requesting a zone change from R9 to R17, which will permit lot sizes as small as 2,000sf. Increased traffic will affect a major portion of our neighborhood, as well as Parkside NA to our west (inactive). We plan to attend the zone-change hearing with a cohesive message. Individuals may also address the hearing. Rebekah Altig will create a Google doc where people can add info.

Thank you to Kate Catenson who attended a Recycle U event online with the City thus earning \$120 for the association.
