Treasurer Report: April Beginning balance: \$3,371.39,; Deposits: \$50 Donation for December Marshall House event Reg Carvalho, \$120 Recycle-U Grant, April Ending Balance: \$3,541.39 Payments: May 2 \$100 for insurance coverage through May 2026

SNA Business: The minutes of the April meeting were approved. Mayor Anne provided her update on the city including the Main Street project and paid parking seven days per week. Fort Vancouver Library: Colleen Smith gave a very informational presentation about the history of our library system and the many opportunities available for everyone at the libraries, including a Seed Library, Adult Drop-in Tech Help, Anime Club, Tai Chi classes, reading materials to check out of course! Newsletter update: Rodney has three openings for delivery volunteers. Bylaws Approval: The bylaws updates were approved unanimously, and the name change from the Neighborhood Association of Shumway Neighbors to the Shumway Neighborhood Association was confirmed.

New/Old Business

H Street Traffic Calming: City Evaluation of applicants in April-May. Evaluation and ranking June-September, Selection and notification in October.

Discussion on sidewalk easements and that home owners are liable for sidewalk repairs and need permits for the repairs and possible funding for repairs or installation of sidewalks.

Upcoming events. August 5 National Night Out Picnic. He will meet with Anne and Terry to ensure we know how they organized for the Picnic. More information at the June 3 meeting. He announced he will not be running for the Chair position and wants to serve on the Neighborhood Clean Up committee and other events. Keith Beers is going to apply for a Community and Neighborhood Grant to help pay for our two events; National Night Out Picnic and Holiday Party at the Marshall House. The next neighborhood meeting is scheduled for June 3rd, with no meeting in July and the August 5 meeting is our Annual Picnic at Shumway Park. The September 2nd meeting will include board member elections.

The current sections the Neighborhood Action Plan subcommittee are updating are: **Mobility Management**

Karen reported the Mobility Management section of the NAP is still awaiting input by the Transportation Department before finalizing. Transportation representatives will be presenting at the June meeting.

Objective #1: Maintain and Expand Shumway Park Amenities

The Shumway Park has changed shape since the remodel at VSAA in recent years. As our neighborhood has grown and younger families have moved in, the park is used daily by VSAA students, neighborhood families, local daycare/preschool businesses, and for SNA functions,

We now have a large open space area along 30th and F Streets, which needs to be updated to include additional shade trees, picnic tables, safety fencing (especially along F Street), and another shade gazebo.
