Dear Neighbors,

The four of us who serve on the Neighborhood Association Board have some concerns that we'd like to share with you. Prior to forming the Association, we knew that there were many City services that our neighborhood could benefit from including grants, neighborhood police officers, traffic calming programs, and so much more, BUT in order to obtain these services, we needed to organize ourselves and become an official City of Vancouver Neighborhood Association. We were also aware of studies that have proven the benefits of fostering community connections, especially in today's world. Not only do we have a closer connection to our City Officials where we are kept informed of events, activities and issues pertinent to us, but we are also building a community where we can count on our neighbors, which improves the safety of our neighborhood. By working together we are a cleaner, safer, healthier neighborhood which improves the lives of us all. Thus, we began the journey of creating an official City of Vancouver Neighborhood Association in 2023 by meeting with City officials and a call out to meet with all our neighbors. Finally, in February 2024, we became the City's 70th official N.A.

Since then,we've been able to do some fun and great things for our community. We purchased and installed the Little Library, we held a picnic with FREE food, music, prizes and a bounce house in the park. We've held several Clean Up Events, sponsored two Neighborhood Garage Sales, held Meet and Greets with some goodies and more! We have more we'd like to do such as Movie in the Park Night, and purchase items and make improvements to our park and common areas. But, this all takes some people power and of course money.

Last year, we were fortunate that we received a \$3,000.00 grant that we applied for from the City to help with our initial expenses (which also includes the cost of our newsletters, and our insurance). Although we do not and cannot collect dues we've received a small amount of donations and not a lot of participation from our neighbors.

WE NEED YOU! We need your ideas and input. We need your time and your financial support. We did not get the larger City grant this year and while we're still applying for a smaller grant to help with this year's expenses, we still cannot do what we'd like to do to help our Neighborhood become a GREAT Community. We deeply appreciate the neighbors who have engaged with us, and would appreciate more involvement from our neighbors. You do not have to be on the board, your help can consist of just attending an event. We've got a lot of ideas we'd like to do for the community but we cannot do it without more consistent help. We don't want to dissolve the Neighborhood Association, but we feel that without increased participation and support we won't be able to keep it up, so PLEASE help us and join us at our next event!

BIG CLEAN UP EVENT UPDATE

We once again partnered up with Burnt Bridge Creek Neighborhood Association for a City of Vancouver Big Clean Up Event on Sat., June 14. at Burnt Creek Elementary School We'd first like to thank Rita, Eli & Erin for volunteering their time and working the event AND for the \$100.00 we received from the City for participating in the event!

This event ran sooo smoothly and if you didn't participate in it this year, plan on it next year. People came in with truck loads of stuff to either throw away, recycle, or even put in the "Too Good To Throw Away Pile" and it only was the cost of a donation. Most people gave \$5–\$10. We saw dishwashers, wash machines, microwaves, furniture, lawn mowers, electronics, old toys, and more being easily sorted and disposed of for all the neighbors who participated. We collected 20.5 tons of "bulky items" aka garbage and 3.2 tons of yard debris. We served 212 vehicles from three neighborhoods.

This is a terrific service provided by the City of Vancouver AND by Neighborhood Associations. THANKS to those who support us!

Fireworks are <u>not</u> **legal in the City of Vancouver.** In 2015, the Vancouver City Council approved a fireworks ordinance (M-4137) that went into effect in October 2016. This ordinance made the sale and use of consumer fireworks inside the city limits of Vancouver a crime. This is a complete ban that includes all types of fireworks. Civil fines start at \$500 for violating this law. (City of Vancouver Website)
