REZONING Plans for Village of Fisher's Landing???

The City of Vancouver is proposing MAJOR zoning changes. It is updating its Comprehensive Plan to guide growth through 2045. This includes rezoning proposals that could significantly alter the Village at Fisher's Landing. The State of Washington passed new regulations to increase "middle housing", and the City must comply. These are the two current proposals:

Possibility A: Corridor Rezoning: Rezones properties along SE 165th Avenue to "mixed use". Allows for residential and commercial development along this corridor.

Possibility B: Full Neighborhood Rezoning: Rezones the entire Village, including the Hamlet, to medium-density residential. Permits a mix of single-family homes, townhomes, and multi-story housing throughout the neighborhood.

Why does this matter?

- 1)Community Character:** potential changes to the neighborhood's look and feel, with impact on property values.
- 2)Infrastructure Impact:** Increased demand on roads, utilities, and public services.
- 3)Housing Diversity:** Introduction of varied housing types and densities, with impact on property values
- 4)Resident Input:** Decisions are being made now: community feedback is crucial. There are MANY ways to become involved in the Public Comment Period before the Plan is presented to the City Council this fall so check these out:

All of VFLNA has CCRs that bind all properties, designed to protect the livability of our community and our property values. They are more restrictive than the Vancouver City Code. Homeowners are notified of violations by CCR Committee chair Bill Hruba.

When violations are noted, then the VFLNA CCR Committee notifies the relevant homeowner of the violation. There are several recurring violation issues:
