August Neighborhood Meeting Summary

August Notes: Port of Vancouver and Community Updates

Attendance: 8 residents

Guest Speaker: Julie Rawls, Community Outreach Manager, Port of Vancouver

Our August meeting featured an in-depth and fascinating presentation from **Julie Rawls**, who shared the history, operations, and future plans of the **Port of Vancouver**.

Key Highlights:

- History & Role: Founded in 1912 to ensure the waterfront stayed in public hands, the Port is now Washington's third oldest and third largest port, and the furthest inland deep-water port on the Columbia River.
- What the Port Handles: Unlike container ports, Vancouver specializes in *break bulk cargo*—large items like wind turbine blades, steel, Subarus, and agricultural exports. The Columbia River is the #1 gateway for wheat in the U.S., and about 13% of the nation's wheat exports pass through the Port.
- **Subaru Partnership:** The Port is the #1 entry point for Subarus in the U.S., handling nearly 100,000 vehicles last year. Most travel east by rail, and the facility even includes charging stations for Subaru's new electric vehicles.
- **Sustainability Efforts:** The Port is investing in electric harbor cranes, a fleet of electric trucks and equipment, and water treatment systems that reduce pollutants before runoff enters the river.
- **Terminal 1 Redevelopment:** Work continues on the 10-acre Terminal 1 site, birthplace of the Port. Plans include a public market (similar to Wenatchee's Pybus Market), a rebuilt dock, and new public spaces. This project will take several years due to environmental restrictions on inwater construction but promises to be a major community asset once completed.

• **Economic Impact:** The Port is home to 50 businesses supporting jobs in brewing, food processing, manufacturing, and logistics. It also manages 42 miles of its own rail track to move goods efficiently.

Julie also shared fun local history—did you know Vancouver was once the Prune Capital of the World? Exports of prunes put our city on the map, complete with prune festivals and even a prune queen!

Community Updates:

- Tower Mall Redevelopment: A city survey is open for feedback on the new civic center design.
- National Night Out: A big thank-you to all who joined us for ice cream, conversation, and community connection! Also thanks to Ron Rasmussen for organizing this event and Pastor Adrian and Immanuel Lutheran for hosting.
