

Neighborly Reminders (1)



- Fall Yard Maintenance: Please rake leaves. trim overgrown shrubs, and keep sidewalks clear to ensure safety for walkers and trick-ortreaters.
- Halloween Safety: Trick-or-treating is on October 31st. Be sure to:
 - Turn on your porch light if you're welcoming trick-or-treaters.
 - Drive extra carefully that evening—kids may be crossing streets unexpectedly.
 - Remind children to wear reflective gear or carry flashlights.
- Fire Safety: Be cautious with candles in jacko'-lanterns—use LED alternatives if possible. Test smoke detectors as we head into colder months and increased heater use.
- Neighborhood Watch & Lights: With shorter days, outdoor lighting and neighborly vigilance help keep our community safe.
- Holiday Mail & Packages: With holidays approaching, package theft can increase. Consider:
 - Using a lockbox or package delivery instructions.
 - Checking with neighbors if you'll be away.
- Daylight Saving Time Reminder: Don't forget to set your clocks back one hour on Sunday, November 3rd!

- The City of Vancouver has Homeless Assistance and Response Team (HART) should you see someone camping in the park and in need of help. Use the MyVancouver App to get help via your phone or Email:
 - hartteam@cityofvancouver.us
 - Voicemail: 360-487-8626.

They will send someone out to assist the individual(s).

- Two free apps for you phone that are highly beneficial: RecycleRight and MyVancouver.
 - RecycleRight from Waste Connections provides a calendar of your pickup day and which cans are to be put out, bulk pickup, and answers to questions on trash and recycling.
 - The MyVancouver app provides requests, resources of unhoused, events calendar and feedback on City projects, plans and initiatives, even crime reporting, and more.

The Tree of Heaven in Bloom



The tree of heaven (Ailanthus altissima) and its blooms may sound lovely, but this fastgrowing tree is an aggressive invasive species throughout North America.

Originally from China, it was introduced in the 1700s for its rapid growth and resilience—but it quickly spread beyond control.

Tree of heaven crowds out plants, damages sidewalks and infrastructure with its roots, and releases chemicals into the soil that prevent other plants from growing.

Even more concerning, tree of heaven is a preferred host for the <u>spotted lanternfly</u>, an invasive pest that poses a serious threat to agriculture and many plants. Spotted lanternfly was recently detected in the region and <u>monitoring efforts</u> are underway.

If you see this tree on your property, removal is important—its roots can regrow if not fully treated. Look for large, compound leaves, smooth gray bark, and a strong, unpleasant odor, described as 'burnt peanut butter' when leaves are crushed. Right now, the female trees are full of seed clusters ready to be picked up by the wind; look for large, orange-red clusters of samaras throughout the crown.

The Power of Having Seat, Voice, Vote

The Airport Green Neighborhood has 216 residences of which 170 are single family homes and 23 duplex homes. Membership is open to all homeowners, businesses, and long-term renters within the geographical limits of our neighborhood. That said, AGNA has roughly 200 registered members which is half of what is possible. Since 1993 Airport Green has been part of the Vancouver Neighborhood Association and has continued to elect an Executive Board of up to 11 members selected and voted for one-year terms to represent and interact with City and County offices to address and hopefully solve issues of concern to the greater body of the AGNA membership.

Please know that there is power in having seat, voice and vote in the AGNA Annual Meeting and the easiest way is to make out a membership application prior to exercise opportunity. For the past several years, those attending the Annual Meeting are able to share their concerns and indicate their interest in what activities the neighborhood provides throughout the year. It is also a means to hold the Executive Board accountable to all residents of Airport Green. The AGNA has always had Voluntary Dues, and have not been increased in a long time. The purpose of the dues is to help fund the different activities so that neighbor's families, friends, children and grand-children can enjoy time together paying a fee each time. An annual Audit is conducted for the expressed purpose to demonstrating the

fiduciary responsibilities of the Executive Board to all residents.

If you're not yet a registered member of AGNA, please make out the attached Membership Application today. If you are already registered, but will not be able to attend the Annual Meeting for whatever reason, a Proxy is also attached to this newsletter to guarantee your seat, voice and vote at this meeting. Our Bylaws require that 20 percent of the membership must be accounted for in order to do business of any kind. Please exercise your right to have Seat, Voice, and Vote now and always.
