



Safe Routes to School



Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is a nationwide movement that aims to make active transportation options safe, convenient, and fun for children traveling to and from school.

In partnership with school districts and other local partners, the City of Vancouver has launched its own SRTS Program that enables and encourages students and caregivers to walk, roll, and bike to school along safe pathways.

Through a combination of education, encouragement and infrastructure improvements, SRTS can improve student safety, reduce congestion near schools, increase physical activity and strengthen community connections.

What can the SRTS Program do for your school?

Here are some examples of what the SRTS Program team can do for schools, parents, caregivers and students:

- Help identify safe walk, roll and bike routes to your school
- Identify and seek funding for safety projects near schools
- Coordinate bike and helmet safety checks at your school
- Help organize encouragement events at your school, such as walk, roll and bike to school day
- Support the start-up of a walking or biking school bus
